Cheder of Miami Set to Open for the **Coming School Year**

Excitement is mounting as Miami Beach residents are looking forward to the opening of a new cheder, Cheder of Miami, to be located right in their neighborhood!

Rabbi Yaakov Burstyn, a veteran mechanech who will be serving as the Menahel, explains the demographics of the Miami community. While outsiders think of Miami as one big community, it is really comprised of several small communities within South Florida, with Miami Beach and North Miami Beach as relatively separate entities, located about a half-hour drive apart. Miami Beach is in the south, North Miami Beach is in the center, and the communities of Aventura. Hollywood and Boca Raton are further north.

"I grew up in Miami Beach, and I have strong family roots here," noted Rabbi Burstyn. "My great-great-grandparents to Miami in the 1920s, when my great-grandfather was a teenager, and my grandfather was born here in the early 1930s. When I was young, there were three frum boys-only schools in Miami Beach. Today, there are zero. This is because in Miami Beach, real estate is very expensive. and there are no campuses available, only buildings. In North Miami, one can get a beautiful campus for a more affordable price."

The three schools are Yeshiva Toras Chaim Toras Emes, Yeshiva Elementary School and Lubavitch Educational Center, all of which have grown and expanded tremendously in recent years and are now located on beautiful campuses in North Miami.

Consequently, children in Miami Beach have to spend close to an hour each morning on a bus or in a carpool, first driving around to pick up all of the students, and then driving to North Miami. During rush hour. the drive is even longer, and parents who drive their children to school have to turn around and drive another half an hour to return home.

The situation was somewhat untenable and was causing great stress for the parents. Rabbi Tzvi Neuhaus, Rav of Ahavas Torah: Miami Torah Center, a visionary Rav in Miami Beach, dreamed of establishing a cheder-type school right in Miami Beach. He approached Rabbi Burstyn, who has been serving as a Rebbi in Beis Moshe Chaim for the past 12 years, under the leadership of Harav Yochanan Zweig, and invited him to serve as the Menahel of the new yeshivah.

Cheder of Miami hopes to open with grades Pre-K through 2nd. Moros and teachers have been hired, and Rabbi Burstyn will serve as the Rebbi of the oldest class. The cheder also plans to serve lunch every day to save the parents the job of preparing lunches and may also provide transportation to ease the burden on the parents.

The cheder will be located in a beautiful house, right next door to the Ahavas Torah Center, and will be able to use the shul for special events, such as a *siddur* or *Chumash* mesibah.

Rabbi Burstzyn adds, "Our main vision is simply to provide the local community with a school. With that in mind, we will also aim to offer small classes and individual attention. We hope we will succeed in giving over the geshmak of Yiddishkeit to our talmidim."
