# Message from the Menahel


Sukkos is zecher to the ananei hakavod. Remembering how Hashem protected us for 40 years in the midbar when we left Mitzrayim- which was after Pesach. So then what is Sukkos doing in the middle of Tishrei? The Vilna Goan says that Sukkos is actually connected to Yom Kippur.

After Klal Yisroel did the *chet ha'eigel*, we lost the *ananei hakavod*. They were taken away from us. But on Yom Kippur, Moshe came down with the second set of *luchos*, and we did *teshuva* for our sin. Five days later the *ananei hakavod* came back!

We see from this, that Sukkos is not just about remembering the ananei hakavod after Hashem took us out of *Mitzrayim*. Sukkos is about the ananei hakavod that was returned to us after we sinned and did *teshuva*.

Now that we have just gone through our own Yom Kippur and did *teshuva*, may we be *zoche* to have and feel the *shechina* constantly with us, just like in the *midbar*.



#### <u>סוכות</u>

On Sukkos we have the special mitzva of shaking the Daled minim; Lulav, Esrog, Hadasim and Aravos.

Why do we take these 4 random things and tie them together?

The Medrash explains that the mitzva of the Daled Minim shows us the importance of Achdus, everyone coming together.

Each one the Daled Minim represent different types of yidden.

**Lulav**: The lulav comes from a date tree. Dates have a good taste but no smell. This represents the Yid who learns Torah but doesn't focus as much on the mitzvos.

**Esrog**: The Esrog has a good smell and a good taste. This represents the Yid who learns lots of Torah and does lots of mitzvos.

Hadasim: The Hadasim have a good smell but no taste. This represents the Yid who does mitzvos but doesn't focus as much on learning Torah.

Aravos: Aravos have no taste and no smell. This represents the Yid who does not focus on the mitzvos or on learning Torah.

On Sukkos we tie all the four types together to show that all the Yidden should come together as one. Even if we are different from each other and we don't think the same or act the same as our friends, the mitzva of Daled Minim is teaching us that we must come together as one and respect everyone no matter what!

When Hashem asked Adam why he ate from the eitz hadas, Adam responded, "The woman that **You** gave me, made me eat it".

Rashi points out that Adam is not appreciating what Hashem gave him. Hashem gave him Chava so that he would not be all alone. But instead of being grateful, he was complaining. Adam should have said, "You're right, I did the wrong thing, I want to do Teshuva. Please forgive me."

Whenever someone does a favor for us we must be careful to smile at them and say, "Thank you so much!" or "I really Appreciate it!", not mumble a thank you or just leave it out altogether.

Let us all work on having Hakaras Hatov, and on that note:

Thank you so much Mommy/Mom/אמא for all the hard work you put in making this delicious Shabbos Seuda!!
