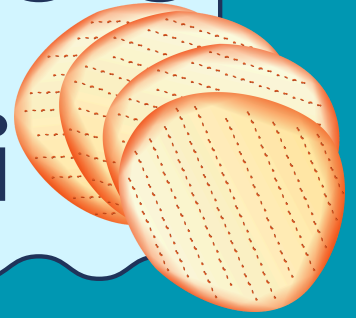

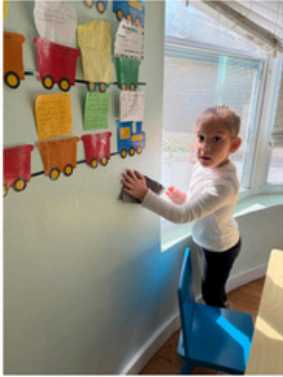

As heard from Rabbi Yechiel Spero, CCHF Live Life Better, **Netzor** recording

This was no ordinary boy!

Before little Moshe even began

packed with potential to become a great **talmid chacham**.

To help him get off to a solid start, the father decided he would give his son a rock-solid foundation. He'd make sure he knew **Chumash** and **Mishnayos** "inside-out and backwards."

When Moshe's father felt his son was ready, he sent him to learn Gemara with other boys his age in their small city in Russia.



On the first day, the rebbi asked Moshe to read the first word in the

Gemara. The word was "**itmar**—it was said." But to Moshe, who was not familiar with common Gemara words, it said "Isamar," Aharon **HaKohen's**

son.

The class burst out laughing and young Moshe's face burned with embarrassment. But his rebbi quickly came to the rescue. "This

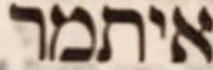
boy is brilliant in **Chumash**," he told them. "He doesn't know the word can be read another way. Never laugh at another

boy. Never scoff at how someone pronounces things."

Later, when this child Moshe became known as Rav Moshe Feinstein, the **gadol hador**, he wrote about this episode in the introduction to the eighth section of **Igros Moshe** to teach two lifelong lessons he learned that day:

The first was that sometimes, we have to see things from another person's point of view. This became an important skill for him as he made decisions in halachah, some of which affected all of Klal Yisrael. And secondly, as his rebbi had told the class—never make fun of the way someone does things. The young Moshe had the inner strength to come back to **cheder** the next day, but someone else might not have done so.
